## KARIMJEE JIVANJEE FOUNDATION DONATES 100 DESKS TO MKWAKWANI SCHOOL

The Karimjee Jivanjee Foundation (KJF) has donated 100 desks worth Tsh.11 million to Mkwakwani Secondary School in Tanga. This donation was made to support the government's effort to offset the existing countrywide shortage of desks in primary and secondary schools.

Speaking at a handover ceremony held at Mkwakwani Secondary School in Tanga municipality, the Karimjee Jivanjee Group and Toyota Tanzania Executive Director, Yusuf Karimjee said the donation is part of KJF's commitment to supporting the education sector in Tanzania and investment on social projects that enrich people's lives. 2016 marks 69 years since the Karimjee Jivanjee family first built what is now known as Mkwakwani Secondary School in Bombo, Tanga. Since then, the family has continued to work closely with the government-run school and others in the country in line with their commitment to education in the region, and Tanzania as a whole.
